Updates in Contemporary Orthodontic Treatment

This course will overview current advances and trends in orthodontic diagnosis and techniques. This will include digital imaging, digital appliance design including clear aligner therapy. The state of DIY orthodontics and dentistry treatment types, possible adverse outcomes and legal questions will be reviewed. An overview of psychological aspect of facial and dental attractiveness and the public perceptions of different malocclusions will be discussed.

"Looking Through the Eyes of the Puzzle."

Two time Ted Talk nominee, Josh Stokes offers a rare look through the eyes of a person diagnosed with Autism. He candidly shares his experiences and how each situation and circumstance he has faced throughout his life as a child and an adult with Autism has made him feel. He and his parents had heard every textbook answer given by doctors and specialists who coach people about how to care for those with Autism. This gives Josh the ability to compare fact and fiction by the retelling of his own thoughts. It wasn't until Josh began giving lectures that his own parents finally felt like they were beginning to get a clearer picture of their son, which is what he hopes to offer to anyone who attends one of his lectures.

The presentation will consist of 3 different sections. Each one around 40 to 50 minutes each with a 10 minute break and a Q and A. During the presentation Josh will explain what Autism is, discuss neurodevelopmental disorder, social interactions and the education/cognitive processes of an ASD individual. Intervention techniques/personal stories will be shared focusing on a dental visit. He will cover sensory overload, enclosed places, waiting, anxiety calming and interaction. He will focus on a typical dental visit: Pre-visit, moment in the door, waiting room and how as dental providers we can lessen the chance of sensory overload in the room/chair, how to keep things calm, and cover the taking of radiographs and dental prophylaxis.
