No matter where we serve, our goal remains the same: to aid in the accessibility and delivery of quality oral health care to the public.

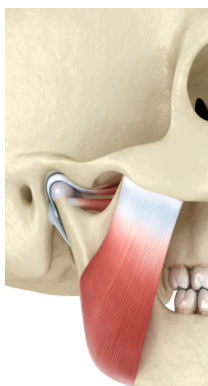
Whether you're a new student or a seasoned professional, the Michigan Dental Assistants Association has something for you!

OSHA/MIOSHA Update for Dental Practices: 3 CEs

This course will review all OSHA and MIOSHA standards that apply to dental settings, including Bloodborne and Infectious Diseases, Hazard Communication and General Workplace Safety. Special topics will include the OSHA directive to develop a workplace emergency plan, changes to the Bloodborne and Infectious Diseases Standard, and if there is a continuation of the MIOSHA Emergency Rules for COVID-19.

Upon completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Evaluate their practice's compliance with OSHA and MIOSHA standards.
- Identify any post-pandemic changes to OSHA and MIOSHA standards.
- Implement strategies to increase safety compliance in the workplace.

Infection Prevention Update: Bloodborne Pathogens to Airborne Transmitted Diseases

This course will review the principles of standard precautions, PPE that is appropriate for dental procedures, instrument reprocessing and quality assurance in infection prevention protocols.
